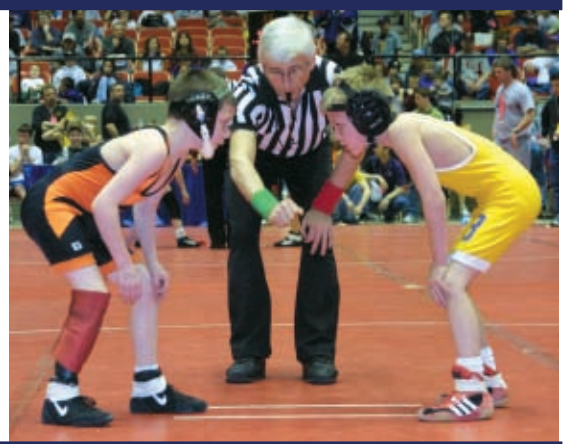
SPORTS COMPETITIONS

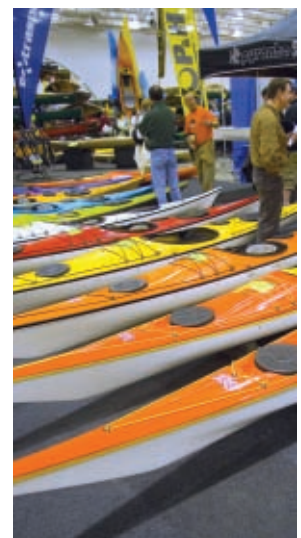

HEISMAN TROPHY WINNER WELCOMES THE WOLFPACK

Former Badger Football standout and Heisman Trophy winner Ron Dayne welcomes the WI Wolfpack to Madison. Fans may even spot him at Wolfpack games this season in the Coliseum.

Some of the newly signed Wolfpack players were able to meet Dayne, including former UW-Platteville quarterback Tom Stetzer.

"We're especially excited to have Tom Stetzer sign on as Wolfpack quarterback," said Ron Tyner, GM of the WI Wolfpack. "He has shown great leadership and his records speak for themselves."

Stetzer played two seasons with the Reading Express of Pennsylvania in the American Indoor Football Association (AIFL) in which he threw over 150 touchdowns, passed for 7,700 total yards, amassed two AIFA North Division Championships and led the team to a record of 17-6.

The Wolfpack's first home game is **March 21** at the **Coliseum**, where they will match up against the Chicago Slaughter, last season's division champions.

"The Wolfpack team was formed months ago, so we've developed a very talented group of players," Tyner said. "We're just so eager to take to the turf and show the league what we can do."

A GOOD MOVE

Now that the Mad Rollin' Dolls Roller Derby League has gotten comfortable skating in front of larger crowds, the action moves to **Exhibition Hall** for the next bout on **March 7**. The move to larger venues is expected to keep things interesting for the ladies as many new fans are enjoying the action.

Because the Dolls schedule alternates between Veterans Memorial Coliseum and Exhibition Hall, the girls need to think on their feet before each bout. Different surfaces create different traction and skating styles, which means they often need to make last-minute changes to their wheels to accommodate the smoothness and speed of a given rink.

The change of venue has been positive for the Dolls. Nearly 1,600 fans came to the Coliseum for the first bout of the season, breaking their previous attendance record of about 1,000. Moving the league to the Alliant Energy Center's venues has given the Dolls a chance to expand upon their success and fan base.

Now in its fifth season, the Mad Rollin' Dolls League consists of four local teams: The Quad Squad, The Reservoir Dolls, The Unholy Rollers and The Vaudeville Vixens. Each bout pits two of these teams against each other for two periods lasting 20 minutes each. The action is fast-paced, exciting and full of bumps and bruises.
